"Macpherson Memorial Stableford Event."

Moved Geoff Cook, seconded Peter Turner; the Country Championship event will be replaced with a new event, the "Malcolm Macpherson Memorial Stableford Event" from 2026. This event will be played with three grades: A.B.C. Individual Stableford, and the winner of the Malcolm Macpherson Memorial event will be the player with the highest Stableford points to receive a medallion in Malcolm's honour.

2026 State Championship at the Horsham Golf Club, David Baker, Wimmera District Captain, reported that all is progressing well for this event.

The VVGA State Championship Plate, which was previously played for and presented as a perpetual trophy to the state champion, will be reinstated and updated.

May 2025 Report Bayside Zone from John Raven

Challenge Event. After discussion timing of this event between Veterans Golf Group South Eastern Suburbs and Mornington Peninsula has been difficult but we should be ok next year.

The 3 groups report that numbers attending events are down again this year. This is a worry, and something will have to change if the groups are going to survive in the long run. At MPVGA it was only 5 years ago when most of our events cost around \$40 - \$50. The same would apply to ESVGA and Veterans Golf Club. Today most of the MPVGA events cost \$80 - \$100. This has impacted membership and event turnout. I have had it reported that the other two groups have experienced similar pressure on numbers.

Solutions seem difficult to find and perhaps we should be looking at combined events to increase numbers and consequently put pressure on clubs to give us a better deal. Sponsorship is an option but because we have no base promotion by our group is difficult.

I think the MPVGA is a little larger than the other two groups but average attendance is now 60 – 80 compared to a few years ago. One positive is the increased numbers attending VVGA events (15 at Lakes Entrance)

May be we need to organise events with country groups where more affordable events can be staged.

Glenelg District are hoping to provide at least a draft flyer for the VVGA Teams event at our upcoming VVGA meeting. I will forward this asap. We are very happy with the number of Glenelg Vets who attend VVGA events.

The VVGA event at Lakes Entrance apparently had quite a few women who joined their District Vets so they could participate at the VVGA event. VVGA used to require a minimum number of District events in order to qualify for VVGA events. I have noticed even in our Glenelg District that some members at the VVGA Colac event have only played one event in the last 12 months. This needs to be addressed as a VVGA issue.
